We're offering a new service where you can book appointments and request prescriptions from your computer at home.

The prescription request service will be replacing the service currently offered through the surgery website. You must select a local chemist for your prescriptions to be sent to.

We also offer a Detailed Records Access which includes results (numerical values and normal range), values (BP, PEFr), problems/diagnoses, procedure codes (medical or surgical) and codes in consultation (signs, symptoms), codes showing referral made or letters received and other codes (ethnicity, QOF).

To take part, please read the following information, and complete the attached form.

What do you need to do?

As you will be able to view your medical records from home we need to make sure this system is quite secure, so please read the following details carefully.

Please complete the attached form, and return it to the surgery in person. It is very important that the confidentiality of your medical information is maintained, so when you come to the surgery you must bring photographic ID proving your name, such as a passport or driving licence. Please also bring a proof of address such as a bank statement or utility bill.

You will need to make a separate application for each member of the family.

We will then issue you a sign-up letter with details about how to sign up to the system.

Patients who are unable to attend the surgery in person may complete the form and send a representative with the patient's ID documents. Please complete the section below the signature strip to show who you are authorising to collect your sign-up letter.

Detailed Record Access takes 21 working days from form being processed.

In addition to giving your consent to collect and process your sensitive and personal data, we are obliged to inform you that we are also required to process your medical data for the following reasons:

- We have a legal and professional obligation to keep such records relating to your health.
- It may be called upon, or referred to, in order to protect your vital interests in situations where a health professional may not be able to directly ask you about your medical history.
- For the purposes of performing a task which may contribute to the wider public interest, such as monitoring the occurrence and spread of certain viruses and illnesses, such as flu.
